Kring Receives Finishing Fund Award!

Women In Film LA recently announced the recipients of its 33rd annual Film Finishing Fund. The nine grantees were chosen from 390 feature-length narrative films, documentaries and shorts that were submitted from 22 countries. **Read full article here**.

For the second year, Stella Artois is awarding four \$25,000 grants to fiction and documentary films by women that inspire social change including END OF THE LINE by WIFV Member, **Shannon**

Kring! "These female filmmakers represent the future of film, which is why we're so proud that through our partnership with Women in Film we're able to help them hone their craft and get their work in front of the industry at film festivals across the

country," said Stella Artois Vice President Lara Krug. "Last year, our Film Finishing Fund grantees highlighted provocative



which Malian women use as an integral part of their dyeing process. Gosling and Downs toured the German factory and interviewed the CEO. The factory exports 70% of their product to West Africa. From there, the filmmakers traveled to Paris, where they interviewed Aboubakar Fofana, a Malian textile artist, known internationally, who dves exclusively using indigo, a plant-based, labor-intensive dyeing tradition, a technique that has been largely forgotten. In Paris, the filmmakers filmed the West African diaspora cultural event, La Nuit de Bazin, and interviewed the event producer, Aicha Sylla from Guinea. The trip concluded in New York, where they met and filmed Aminata Maiga, a Mauritanian woman proprietor of a boutique that sells bazin in Harlem. The trip was productive and added surprising elements to the overall story. The filmmakers will return to Mali in the fall of 2019 to continue filming and conduct additional research.
