

The Writers Lab DEADLINE March 14


The Writers Lab is excited to return in 2019 for its fifth edition. Backed by Meryl Streep and Nicole Kidman, produced by New York Women in Film & Television, with co-founders Elizabeth Kaiden and Nitza Wilon, The Writers Lab is an intensive narrative feature screenplay development retreat for women over the age of 40.

All 2019 applicants will have access to an exclusive webinar hosted by Academy and Sundance Award winning producer Lisa Cortes (PRECIOUS, THE WOODSMAN).

The Writers Lab provides a unique and nurturing experience for 12 talented female screenwriters. Selected writers will attend a four-day retreat with outstanding female film mentors, engaging in panels, peer discussions and one-on-one meetings in an idyllic location in Chester, Connecticut in October 2019.

The Writers Lab is dedicated to amplifying the voices of women screenwriters and strives for a new landscape where audiences have access to stories and characters from the perspective of the female gaze, where the female narrative is heard in equal proportion to the male narrative. Applicants must be female and at least 40 years of age by August 1, 2019. Submissions must be feature-length narrative scripts in English.

The WIFV Board of Directors is pleased to offer a Seed Fund for Documentary Filmmakers to support the work of its members. Few Seed Funds exist for documentary filmmakers. WIFV understands the importance of first-in support and is grateful for the many contributions it has received from its members to support this program. In addition to a grant of \$2,500, WIFV will offer mentoring and bring the power of our programming events and workshops to address key education needs.

Grants may be used in the research and development phase of any documentary project and must be spent within 12 months of notice of the award. The grant will

be distributed in two parts - 50% upon notice of award; 50% after receipt of progress report (that can be submitted at any time after 30 days of the initial grant) and within 12 months of the original award.

The first Seed Fund grants were made in 2016. Recipients of the Seed Fund for Documentary Filmmakers include Emily Cohen, Betsy Cox, Kristin Reiber Harris, Katie Lannigan, Kimberly McFarland, and Krystal Tingle.

Applications will be accepted from current WIFV members only. WIFV membership is open to anyone making screen-based media. Information on membership is available **here**. Narrative projects will not be eligible for funding. Documentary projects that include re-creations or re-enactments are eligible for funding.


