Tracy Baumgardner Gets Nat Geo TV Team Emmy® Nomination

Congratulations to editor Tracy Baumgardner, part of a talented team from National Geographic Television that recently received an Emmy® nomination for Outstanding Nature Programming for *War Elephants* - a courageous story of elephant conservation in Mozambique. Baumgardner receives the nomination alongside co-editor Penny Trams, producer/writer David Hamlin, and Executive Producer Jared Lipworth. "*War Elephants* is also is a finalist for "Best People and Wildlife Program" at the prestigious Jackson Hole Wildlife Film Festival. The team heads to the Emmys® on October 1 at New York's Lincoln Center.

Joy Cheriel Brown, founder of Third Person Omniscient Productions, is in pre-production on a narrative short film called *N.O.S.*, about a young woman who is hospitalized for

"psychosis n.o.s." and must figure out why she is in the hospital and how she can get out. (The term, NOS, a depressive disorder, translates to Not Otherwise Specified.) The film is based on Brown's own experience and will be used in the mental health community to help patients who have Schizoaffective Disorder begin a conversation with their therapists on the road to recovery. "I'm taking a risk sharing such a personal film," she says, "but I believe it will help others who find themselves in the same situation. I wish something like it was around when I first experienced the illness." Last spring, Brown served as a mentor for the DC Shorts Mentor

"Our most ambitious project," he notes, "is Slaves, an exposé of current human trafficking in America.
