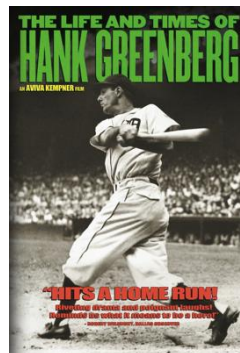

The Peabody Award-winning *The Life and Times of Hank Greenberg* is a humorous and nostalgic documentary about an extraordinary baseball player who transcended religious prejudice to become an American icon. Hammerin' Hank's accomplishments for the Detroit Tigers during the Golden Age of Baseball rivaled those of

Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig. America's first Jewish baseball star was a beacon of hope to American Jews who faced bigotry during the Depression and World War II. The newly-released two disc commemorative DVD set includes more than two hours of extras, such as a never used telephone interview with Ted Williams and new interviews with Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, former player Minnie Minoso and White Sox owner Jerry Reinsdorf.

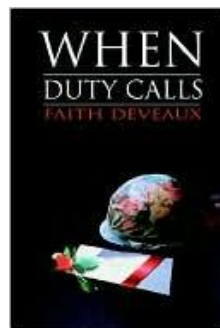

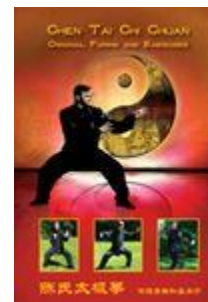
Black Wolf Red Blues Album MP3
