African artist converts used bottle tops into wall hangings. Vogel is founding director of New York's Museum for African Art and a former curator of African Art at the Met. Vogel also produced another festival feature, *The Future of Mud: A Tale of Houses and Lives in Djenne*, about exotic mud architecture in Mali.

2013 Environmental Film Festival in the Nation's Capital Features 24 Women Filmmakers

The 21st annual Environmental Film Festival in the Nation's Capital, which runs from March 12 through 24, presents 190 documentary, narrative, animated, archival, experimental and children's films selected to provide fresh perspectives on environmental issues facing our planet. The vital role of rivers and watersheds in the global environment is a special theme of the 2013 Festival, which features cinematic work from 50 countries, 110 premieres and the work of 96 women filmmakers. Of the 196 filmmakers and special guests that will be discussing their work at the Festival, 24 are women directors and producers.
