documentary. All of these films should be household names. Consider this your feminist homework for the start on the new school year/election season.

ABORTION HELPLINE: THIS IS LISA is an extremely powerful short documentary filmed inside a call center for women who can't afford to pay for an abortion. It was directed by Mike Attie, who lives right up the road in Philadelphia. The film was short-listed for the 2019 Academy Awards and is now **streaming for free on Vimeo**. It is well worth the 13-miutes of your time.

RESISTERHOOD is WIFV member, **CJ Crim**'s powerful 2020 documentary which follows the stories of DC-area women during the Trump administration who are trying change local politics. **It's available to stream on the film's website**.

9TO5: THE STORY OF A MOVEMENT is a harsh, yet entertaining history of Women's Rights in America. It documents the struggle women had to endure simply for the right to work in this country – and this wasn't that long ago. The film is by prolific documentary filmmakers and Oscar winners Julia Reichert & Steven Bognar, and is currently streaming on Netflix.

BOMBSHELL is a feature film that tells the true story of abuse women endured at Fox News under the leadership of Roger Ailes.




