

MISS PATIENT in Festival



She recently completed casting for NO MORE MEN in Washington, DC, and WHATEVER MAKES US HAPPY in Baltimore, MD, while also sourcing cast and crew for FATAL FURY and a Survival Media Agency film in Boston, MA. As the curator and director of the Afrofuturist Femmes Film Festival, MacKenzie is deeply connected to a diverse network of actors across the DMV and East Coast. With a passion for bringing stories to life through



casting, she has played a key role in more than a dozen feature films, TV shows, and shorts that have premiered on top networks and streaming platforms. Rooted in Legacy: The Impact of Maryland Forestry Heritage Through Film

Research is at the heart of every impactful doc. For **Cheryle Franceschi** of **Por Eco Productions/One Idea Dos Languages**, that meant literally walking in the footsteps of a forester. To create her self-funded



film, MR. BESLEY'S FOREST, she enrolled in the UMD Extension Woodland Stewardship Program, gaining on-the-ground experience that would later support her volunteer service as Chairwoman Emerita of the Carroll County Forestry Board. An approach to storytelling by walking-the-walk to gain a better understanding of the field of forestry.

Since 2020, her film about Maryland's first State Forester, Fred W. Besley, has aired on Maryland Public Television, continues to stream on PBS, and is distributed nationally by NETA. Another special sharing of the legacy of Maryland's First State Forester continues this Earth Month. In celebration of scientific forest management this National Arbor Day, viewers can tune in to watch the local encore of MR. BESLEY'S FOREST, on Friday, April 25th at 11pm on MPT2.

Fred W. Besley, a pioneer of forestry conservation, created The Big Tree Program in 1925 —now celebrating its 100th year. His legacy lives on through the "National Register of Champion Trees" that is managed today by the University of Tennessee.

Last month, Franceschi was honored to screen MR. BESLEY'S FOREST at the "Maryland Big Tree Program Centennial Reunion Luncheon" in Port Deposit, MD. She ended the day with a meaningful photo alongside two film interviewees, John Bennett of the Maryland Big Tree Program and Writer Francis "Champ" Zumbrun (pictured above) —bringing her journey full circle.
