

Erika "ET" Timmons' directorial debut short film, WRITERS IN THE SHADOWS, will also grace the silver screens of not one but two film festivals in May. The first at the 25th anniversary of the African American Women in Cinema (AAWIC) festival taking place in NYC May 15-17. The second will be at the International Black & Diversity Film Festival (IBDFF) in Ontario, Canada May 29-31. WRITERS IN THE SHADOWS has already won an award at IBDFF. The category will be announced during the red carpet gala!

Ferry at Ebertfest

Brandon Ferry participated in the 26th annual **Ebertfest**, April 23-26 at the Virginia Theatre in Champaign, IL. Also known as Roger Ebert's Film Festival, Ebertfest focuses on underseen and underappreciated cinema gems from years past and great films that are still awaiting distribution deals. Since Roger's passing in 2013, his multi-talented wife Chaz (co-founder of Ebertfest) has carried on the torch as the festival's producer and host, alongside the festival's director, Nate Kohn.

As the booking producer for **WIFV's** *MediaMaker Spotlight*, Brandon booked Chaz Ebert on the podcast last month and host **Sandra Abrams** interviewed her (episode to drop later this summer!) Chaz then invited him to this year's festival to both interview attending filmmakers for the podcast and participate as a panelist on the films' post-screening discussion panels (composed of filmmakers, critics, and film scholars). Be on the lookout this summer for Brandon's *Live from Ebertfest* interviews on *MediaMaker Spotlight* with Susan Seidelman (director of DESPERATELY SEEKING SUSAN and episodes of SEX AND THE CITY), Angus MacLachlan (writer-director of **A LITTLE PRAYER** starring David Strathairn & Jane Levy and the writer of Amy Adams' breakout film, JUNEBUG), and David Fortune (writer-director of the upcoming father-son drama, *COLOR BOOK*). DC/DOX and Raskin Receive Grants

WIFV is excited to announce that two fiscally-sponsored projects have received 2025 HumanitiesDC grants!

Over four days, June 12-16, DC/DOX takes place in marquee

venues across Washington, DC, presenting an exceptional lineup of 100+ feature and short documentaries from around the world. Every screening is a Washington, DC premiere and is followed by filmmaker Q&As and thought-provoking post-screening discussions. The Reality Check Forum—a series of panels, masterclasses, and workshops—dives into the evolving landscape of documentary filmmaking, providing a space for discovery, dialogue, and innovation for filmmakers to advance their craft. **Sky Sitney** is the Festival Director and Co-Founder of DC/DOX with Jamie Shor.

NOTES OF A CITIZEN: The Marcus Raskin Story, produced/directed by **Eden Raskin Jenkins**, is a feature-length documentary that explores the personal life of a public figure told by his daughter. The film focuses on a prolific time in Marcus' life in the 1960s/70s when he was indicted with the Boston Five for Vietnam Draft Resistance, involved with the civil rights movement, helped release the Pentagon Papers, and founded a first of its kind progressive think tank that was infiltrated by the FBI. Through the archives he left behind, the music he played, and intimate conversations with the people who knew him best, she explores how a piano prodigy from Wisconsin shook up Washington by becoming the conscience of Kennedy's White House whose activism proudly landed him on Nixon's Enemies List. Atlas & Real Women Have Curves on Broadway

The Broadway debut of the musical "Real Women Have Curves" has garnered many positive reviews and much love from audiences. Based on a play by Josefina Lopez and the subsequent 2002 HBO film cowritten by Lopez & George LaVoo, the musical stars high-wattage newcomer Tatianna Cordoba as Ana and Justina Machado (In the Heights, Six Feet Under, Queen of the South) as her fierce mother.



With book by noted playwright Lisa Loomer & Nell Benjamin and music and lyrics from Joy Huerta & Benjamin Velez, it offers fun, uplifting ballads focusing on a message of female empowerment and body image acceptance and has received raves from Entertainment Weekly and the New York Stage Review. Its continued topicality on the U.S.' changing policies on immigration as well as the charisma and charm of the ensemble have also earned it strong recommendations from *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post* and *The Chicago Tribune*.

The musical's several iterations have long been nurtured by WIFV fan favorite guest speaker **Marilyn R. Atlas**, who also co-produced the film. The first musical production was launched in L.A. in 2008 by Atlas. WIFV always supports each other's professional
