
Mosley Photos Featured at World Pride 2025

Fifteen percent of the photographs at the Rainbow History Project's World Pride 2025 exhibit at Freedom Plaza were taken by her over a 46-year period (two are featured above). WIFV Members Release New Film about DC's LGBTQ History

A trio of WIFV members worked together on a new documentary that's coming to WETA and MPT later this month. LOU'S LEGACY: A REPORTER'S LIFE AT THE WASHINGTON BLADE tells the story of two DC icons: legendary newspaper reporter Lou Chibbaro Jr. and Donnell Robinson, a beloved drag performer who has been entertaining Washington's LGBTQ community as "Ella Fitzgerald" since 1975. Produced by The Mattachine Society of Washington, DC, the 30-minute documentary traces the city's gay history through the lens of Lou's nearly five-decade career at the Blade,



where he has chronicled stories that the mainstream media often ignored or erased. As Lou reports a news story about Ella's triumphant return to the stage after a three-year hiatus during Covid, the two trailblazers reflect on their parallel journeys — and discuss the rising backlash facing the LGBTQ community, including laws targeting drag performers.

Patrick Sammon is the film's director, producer, and writer. Julianne Donofrio was the producer. Ben Weinberg from Sandwich Post Production handled motion graphics. WETA will broadcast LOU'S LEGACY on Saturday, June 21 at 8 pm and Monday, June 23 at 9:30 pm. MPT will present the film on June 28 at 10 pm. It will also be streaming on WETA.org starting June 21. 
